**I. Opening Remarks**

**Israel Hernandez** welcomed everyone and confirmed they had reached quorum.

**Carlos Diaz de Leon** gave the instructions for the translation services.

**Israel Hernandez** mentioned the recording consent guidelines to the public. He said they reached quorum.

**Christian Froelich** welcomed **William Cooper** and another attendee from Calipatria.

**II. Public Comment Period**

There were no public comments.

**III. Approval of Minutes**

**Sergio Cabañas** motioned to approve the April 8th and 15th meeting minutes.

**Hector Cervantes** seconded the motion.

**Mario Lopez** made an inaudible comment.

**Sergio Cabañas** revised his motion. His full explanation was inaudible.

**Fernanda Vega** seconded the motion.

**Israel Hernandez** reminded the committee members to have their mics turned on and close to them whenever they had a comment.

The motion passed.

**IV. Presentations**

**AB 617 North-End Phase 1 Community Input Survey Results, Emily Weissinger & Kaitlyn Elkind; Ramboll**

**Eric Reyes** asked if the data captured from the existing regulatory monitors and the IVAN Network would be shared with the committee so they can create a baseline.

**Emily Weissinger** mentioned **Monica Soucier** presented historical data from the APCD monitors a few months back. She said they could look into that data. She commented they had not processed the IVAN data but added that they could work with CCV to extract it.

**Eric Reyes** asked if they could also have the data from the monitors near the geothermal plants.

**Emily Weissinger** said they would check with the Air District to see if the geothermal plants are doing any self-monitoring.

**Israel Hernandez** commented they can ask their permitting team for feedback and discuss it in a future meeting.

**A member** asked if the geothermal plants were regulating themselves or an outside entity.

**Israel Hernandez** mentioned they are regulated by local, state, and federal rules.

**Emily Weissinger** said she was referring to whether the plants had monitors on site.

**Israel Hernandez** mentioned the plants do not have on-site monitoring.

## **V. Action Items**

### **CAMP – PM Sensor Location Finalization Discussion and Selection, Sergio Valenzuela & Jose Landeros; SCS Engineering.**

**Eric Reyes** asked if they had asked the fire department for monitoring permission.

**Sergio Valenzuela** made an inaudible comment.

**Eric Reyes** said he would prefer the airport.

**Sergio Valenzuela** mentioned they could explore more options further north.

**Eric Reyes** agreed with having the Padilla Pace Elementary School as a monitoring location.

**Israel Hernandez** said that identifying the sites was a good starting point.

**Sergio Cabañas** made an inaudible comment.

**Sergio Valenzuela** made an inaudible comment.

**Christian Froelich** asked if there was an agreement for residential installations.

**Sergio Valenzuela** said there was.

**Sergio Cabañas** made an inaudible comment.

He also mentioned three acres of open land behind a hotel in Calipatria that kicked up dust and should have a monitoring location nearby. He suggested a property near the city yard with 2 IID buildings nearby.

**Hector Cervantes** made an inaudible comment.

**Mario Lopez** made an inaudible comment.

**Sergio Cabañas** made an inaudible comment.

**Sergio Valenzuela** made an inaudible comment.

**Hector Cervantes** made an inaudible comment.

**Belen Leon** made an inaudible comment. She asked if they were looking at the boundary. She said they needed to capture the PM measurements in the area. She commented that it was difficult to distinguish where the pollutants were coming from and how this was also an issue with the New River.

**Israel Hernandez** said they were also testing for H<sub>2</sub>S in the New River. He mentioned that for the location being presented, they would not be monitoring for H<sub>2</sub>S so it would be a suitable location for PM monitoring.

**Belen Leon** reminded the committee that they could expand the locations.

**Hector Cervantes** made an inaudible comment.

**Christian Froelich** suggested that the wastewater treatment plant could be a good monitoring location.

**Hector Cervantes** made an inaudible comment.

**Israel Hernandez** asked the committee how they wanted to manage the voting for the locations.

**Sergio Cabañas** made an inaudible comment.

**Sergio Valenzuela** made an inaudible comment.

**Israel Hernandez** went through the location list and asked the committee for their last thoughts.

The committee discussed the monitoring locations.

**Israel Hernandez** said the three Brawley sites were Magnolia Elementary School, Guadalupe Park, and Jeffrey Thornton Park. He commented that the Westmorland sites were the Westmorland baseball field, the one hundred block East 1st Street residence, and the J&J Tire Shop. The selected Calipatria sites were inaudible.

**Sergio Cabañas** motioned to approve the Brawley locations of Magnolia Elementary School, Guadalupe Park, Jeffrey Thornton Park, and a fourth location.

**Hector Cervantes** seconded the motion.

The motion passed.

**Sergio Cabañas** motioned to approve the Westmorland locations of the Westmorland baseball field, the one hundred block East 1st Street residence, and the J&J Tire Shop.

**Fernanda Vega** seconded the motion.

**Eric Reyes** asked if they could receive a timeline regarding the budget and RFPs.

**Israel Hernandez** mentioned the locations the committee selected were part of the CAMP. He said the results from Ramboll's survey were part of the CERP. He mentioned once the survey was approved the committee could start emitting RFPs.

**Emily Weissinger** said **Israel Hernandez** was correct. She mentioned they were currently rounding out the technical foundations for the CERP. She said that one part of the foundation for the CERP was receiving a community-level emissions inventory from CARB. She added that once they receive the inventory, they can start discussing what strategies they want to use. She said that they would like to start generating ideas around late summer.

**Israel Hernandez** mentioned the state revised their CAP incentive guidelines. He said these changes allowed the committees to do more types of projects. He mentioned CARB would be doing a presentation about the guideline updates in the Southend's following meeting. He said they would ask CARB if they could present it to the north-end committee as well.

**Hector Cervantes** asked an inaudible question.

**Israel Hernandez** commented the Heber Townsite Improvement Project was initially community-identified. He said that meant the committee had to go through a longer process to get it approved. He mentioned that with the update, the project can now be done within the state.

**Sergio Cabañas** made an inaudible comment.

**Belen Leon** made an inaudible comment.

**Israel Hernandez** said August would be the following in-person meeting. He commented he would subscribe the North-end committee members to the South-end emailing list so they could receive the meeting invite.
